We understand the goal of this Act is to end the violence and human rights violations caused by the mining of conflict minerals in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and adjoining countries and to prevent armed groups in these regions from directly or indirectly benefiting from the sale of conflict minerals.

Though Brandywine Communications is a small and privately owned company and is not subject to the requirement of reporting to the SEC in regards to the use of Conflict Minerals legislation, Brandywine Communications is however committed and supports the end of violence and human rights violations and supports our customers that are subject to the requirement of reporting to the SEC.

We will continue to do our due diligence and in the future if we determine the use of any minerals from the Conflict Region are in use in our products, we will take action to transition the product to become "DRC conflict-free".
